Match background

One of European football's most enduring – and even – rivalries is renewed for a first time in more than 15 years as Manchester United welcome Juventus to Old Trafford.

- Perennial UEFA Champions League rivals around the turn of the century, Juventus travel to England with the upper hand in Group H having won both their games so far to collect six points, two more than their second-placed opponents.

Previous meetings

- The last of the sides' 12 past contests came in the 2002/03 second group stage, when United won both games – 2-1 in Manchester and 3-0 in Turin. Both sides would progress to the quarter-finals, but while that was where United's campaign ended, Juve went all the way to the final, losing on penalties to AC Milan back at Old Trafford.

- United have won the last three matches between the clubs – a run that started with a famous comeback in the semi-final second leg of their victorious 1998/99 campaign. After a 1-1 draw in England, Juve looked set to reach the final thanks to Filippo Inzaghi's early double in Turin, but United hit back to win 3-2 on the night and 4-3 on aggregate, going on to beat Bayern München in dramatic circumstances in the final.

- The teams met eight times between 1996 and 2003, all in the UEFA Champions League. Juventus won three of the first four in that sequence (L1) but none of the last four (D1 L3).

- Overall the sides have each won five matches, with two draws – each scoring 15 goals.

Form guide

Manchester United

- Having eased to a 3-0 victory at debutants Young Boys on matchday one, United were held to a goalless home draw by Valencia in their second fixture.

- Second in last season's Premier League, United are in the group stage for the second year running and the 22nd time overall – fewer only than the 23 participations of Real Madrid, Barcelona and Porto.

- José Mourinho's side finished top of their section in 2017/18 ahead of Basel, CSKA Moskva and Benfica, but then bowed out in the first knockout round, losing 2-1 on aggregate to Sevilla (0-0 away, 1-2 home) in the last 16.

- The Red Devils have lost only three of their last 22 European matches, home and away (W14 D5).

- United won all three home games in last season's group stage; the Sevilla loss ended a 21-match unbeaten run in Europe at Old Trafford (W17 D4), since a 2-1 reverse against Real Madrid in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg.

- The English club have won all their last five home matches against Italian visitors – most recently a 4-0 defeat of AC Milan in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg – keeping clean sheets in the last four. United are unbeaten in their last eight matches with Serie A clubs, home and away (W6 D2).

Juventus

- The Bianconeri are still to concede in Group H having won both games; they overcame the first-half dismissal of former United forward Cristiano Ronaldo to win 2-0 at Valencia on matchday one, Miralem Pjanić scoring both goals from the penalty spot. A Paulo Dybala hat-trick sealed a 3-0 defeat of Young Boys in Turin last time out.

- Juventus claimed their seventh successive Serie A title in 2017/18, and are in the UEFA Champions League group stage for the 19th time overall. They last failed to reach the round of 16 in 2013/14.

- In last season's UEFA Champions League, Juve finished second to Barcelona in their section before ousting Tottenham in the round of 16 (2-2 home, 2-1 away). Their season looked to be over when they went down 3-0 at home to Real Madrid in the quarter-final first leg – a repeat of the 2017 final, won 4-1 by the Spanish side – only for Juve to score three times in the return. Ronaldo, however, had the last word against his current club, converting a penalty deep into added time to end Juve's campaign.

- Juventus kicked off their 2017/18 UEFA Champions League campaign with a 3-0 defeat at Barcelona but are unbeaten in five away games since, winning the last four.

- Juve are on an eight-match (W4 D4) unbeaten run against Premier League clubs, winning four of the last five. The victory at Tottenham last season extended their away run without defeat to four matches (W2 D2); Juve had lost their previous seven games in England.

- Winners in 1985 and 1996, Juventus have played in nine European Cup finals – losing a record seven, including all of their last five.

Links and trivia

- Cristiano Ronaldo was a Manchester United player between 2003 and 2009, scoring in the club's victory in the 2008 UEFA Champions League final – although he also had a penalty saved in the shoot-out. He won three Premier League titles, the FA Cup and two English League Cups, scoring 118 goals in 292 appearances for United.
- Paul Pogba left United for Juventus in 2012, returning to Manchester in 2016. He scored 28 goals in 124 Serie A games for Juve, winning the Scudetto in each of his four seasons and appearing in the 2015 UEFA Champions League final.
- José Mourinho was coach of Internazionale Milano between 2008 and 2010, winning two Serie A titles and the UEFA Champions League in 2009/10 to complete the treble. His record against Juve as Inter coach was W3 D1 L1.
- Mourinho was coach of Ronaldo and Sami Khedira at Real Madrid between 2010 and 2013, and Juan Cuadrado at Chelsea in 2015.

- Pogba scored in France's FIFA World Cup final victory against Croatia in July, Mario Mandžukić scoring both a goal and an own goal for Croatia. Blaise Matuidi was also in the France line-up.
- Mandžukić scored the extra-time winner in Croatia's semi-final against an England side featuring Jesse Lingard, Ashley Young and Marcus Rashford.
- Ronaldo scored a hat-trick past David de Gea as Spain and Portugal drew 3-3 in the World Cup group stage.

Latest news

Manchester United

- United ended a run of four games without a win in all competitions (D3 L1) by recovering from conceding twice in the first ten minutes to beat Newcastle 3-2 at Old Trafford on 6 October, Alexis Sánchez scoring a late winner – his first club goal since 21 April.
- United were denied victory at Mourinho's former club Chelsea on Saturday by a goal deep into added time, having to settle for a 2-2 draw.
- Anthony Martial scored both goals at Chelsea and has three in his last two appearances for United.
- Romelu Lukaku had scored four goals in four United matches before matchday one, but has drawn a blank in his last seven appearances.
- Lukaku did, however, score both goals in Belgium's 2-1 UEFA Nations League win against Switzerland on 12 October and has five in his last four outings for his country.
- Marcus Rashford scored one – past club-mate David de Gea – and set up another in England's 3-2 UEFA Nations League win in Spain on 15 October.
- Eric Bailly was on target in Ivory Coast's 4-0 win against the Central African Republic in CAF Africa Cup of Nations qualifying on 12 October.

- Luke Shaw and Nemanja Matić both withdrew from international duty with ankle injuries, both returning at Chelsea, when Ander Herrera (ankle) made his first appearance since 25 September as a substitute.
- Scott McTominay was withdrawn at half-time against Newcastle and has been suffering with a knee problem. Jesse Lingard (groin) has not played since 25 September while Marouane Fellaini has a hamstring injury.
- Marcos Rojo, who has not played this season, is suffering from a minor injury.
- On 18 October, Shaw agreed a new five-year contract with United.

Juventus

- Leonardo Bonucci made his 50th UEFA Champions League appearance on matchday two, a landmark Alex Sandro and Andrea Barzagli will reach with their next games in the competition.
- Juve's winning start to the season was ended by a 1-1 home draw against Genoa on Saturday, the first Serie A game they had failed to win since 13 May.
- Juventus had previously won ten out of ten in all competitions this season – setting a new mark for their best start, surpassing the eight successive wins at the start of 1930/31.
- The Genoa draw was the first time Juve had failed to score two goals or more in this season; they had also kept five clean sheets in their previous six matches.
- The Turin team started their bid for an eighth successive Serie A title with eight consecutive wins.
- Juve have lost only once in their last 34 Serie A matches, winning 28.
- Rodrigo Bentancur struck his first Juventus goal in the 2-0 win at Udinese on 6 October, Cristiano Ronaldo getting the other. Ronaldo, who was also on target in the Genoa draw, has five goals and four assists in his last six Serie A appearances.
- His goal at the weekend made Ronaldo the first player to score 400 goals in the top five European leagues: 84 in the Premier League for Manchester United, 311 in the Liga for Real Madrid and five in Serie A for Juventus.
- Paulo Dybala limped out of the friendly between Argentina and Brazil on 16 October with a right knee injury, but came on in the second half against Genoa.
- Federico Bernardeschi scored in Italy's 1-1 friendly draw against Ukraine on 10 October and, together with Giorgio Chiellini and Bonucci, was in the side that beat Wojciech Szczęsny's Poland 1-0 four days later, confirming the Poles' relegation from UEFA Nations League Group A.
- Alex Sandro scored his first goal for Brazil in a 2-0 friendly win against Saudi Arabia on 12 October.
- Juventus announced that Emre Can is sidelined as he will have to be monitored for a thyroid problem that could require surgical treatment.
- Sami Khedira has not played since suffering a thigh injury on matchday one, although Douglas Costa (ankle) returned against Genoa having also been out since Juve's first UEFA Champions League game.
- Mattia De Sciglio has not featured this season due to a thigh problem while Daniele Rugani (ribs) has not played since 23 September, although both were unused substitutes at the weekend.
- Full-back Leonardo Spianazzola was not included in the UEFA Champions League squad as he is recovering from knee surgery.
- Ronaldo's overhead kick for Real Madrid against his current club Juventus in last season's UEFA Champions League quarter-final first leg was voted UEFA.com Goal of the Season.

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting CP, Porto and Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s. As coach, had a nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of Monaco in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Took over at Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European Cup since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Real Madrid. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.
- Won a third Premier League title with the London club in 2015, also adding the English League Cup. Left in December 2015 and appointed Manchester United manager the following summer, leading the club to the League Cup and the UEFA Europa League in his first season in charge.

Massimiliano Allegri

Date of birth: 11 August 1967

Coaching career: Aglianese, SPAL, Grosseto, Sassuolo, Cagliari, AC Milan, Juventus

- A creative attacking midfielder, Allegri started out in his native Tuscany with Cuoioielli and then Livorno, his hometown club. First appeared in Serie A for Pisa against Milan in 1988/89 but played only twice that season before heading back to Livorno.
- Returned to Serie A after helping Pescara win promotion in 1992. The following term he scored 12 goals under Giovanni Galeone, the coach Allegri still considers his mentor. After leaving Pescara in 1993, had spells at Cagliari, Perugia, Padova and Napoli before hanging up his boots back in Tuscany with fourth division Aglianese in 2003.
- Moved straight into coaching at Aglianese, prior to taking charge at SPAL and Grosseto. In November 2008 he won the Panchina d'Oro (golden bench) as the third division's best coach having led Sassuolo to promotion.
- Had earlier been appointed by Cagliari whom he led to ninth place in 2009, winning the Panchina d'Oro again, this time as Serie A's best coach. A bad run of results the following season prompted Allegri's dismissal on 13 April 2010 – although he had already done enough to earn a two-year contract at Milan.
- Allegri's first season at San Siro ended with his new club winning the Scudetto for the first time since 2004. Dismissed in January 2014 with Milan 11th in Serie A, that summer he was appointed to succeed Antonio Conte at Juventus. Allegri won the Scudetto and the Coppa Italia with Juventus in his first season, also taking his side to the final of the UEFA Champions League, and added further domestic doubles in 2015/16, 2016/17 – when they again reached the UEFA Champions League final – and 2017/18.
