## Match background

---

Liverpool and Crvena zvezda are both hoping to bounce back from matchday two defeats when they meet for the first time in 45 years in the third round of Group C matches.

- The Reds are second in the section on three points, with the Serbian debutants on one point but needing to respond positively to suffering their joint heaviest European defeat last time out.

### Previous meetings

- The only past contests between the sides – and Liverpool's only experience of Serbian opposition – came in the second round of the 1973/74 European Cup, Crvena zvezda winning both legs 2-1 to reach the quarter-finals, where they would lose to Atlético Madrid. The Anfield result was Liverpool's first home loss in UEFA competition; the second did not follow for another 18 years.
- The first leg of the Crvena zvezda-Liverpool tie, in Belgrade, was played on 24 October 1973 – 45 years to the day before this game.

### Form guide

#### Liverpool

- Having scored a last-gasp winner to defeat Paris Saint-Germain 3-2 at home on matchday one, the tables were turned on Liverpool last time out, a 90th-minute Lorenzo Insigne strike earning Napoli a 1-0 success in Italy.
- Fourth in the Premier League in 2017/18, Liverpool are in the group stage for the second season running, having featured once in the previous seven.
- Liverpool scored an average of 3.15 goals per game in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League.
- The five-time winners reached their eighth European Cup final in 2017/18, when they won five of their seven UEFA Champions League home matches (qualifying included), drawing the others.
- Before being held 2-2 by Sevilla on matchday one last season, Liverpool's previous six European games at Anfield had all produced a home win. They are unbeaten in their last 17 European home matches (W12 D5), since a 3-0 loss to Real Madrid on 22 October 2014.
- The Reds have lost three of their last four European matches.

#### Crvena zvezda

- The Belgrade club were beaten 6-1 at Paris in their second fixture, equalling their biggest margin of defeat in European competition. Their first game in the UEFA Champions League proper ended in a goalless draw at home to Napoli.
- Despite that defeat, Crvena zvezda have lost only three of their last 19 European games (W7 D9).
- The Belgrade club have drawn two of their four European away games this season, and have lost only two of their last nine (W3 D4) – in Paris and 1-0 at CSKA Moskva in last season's UEFA Europa League round of 32 second leg to lose by the same aggregate scoreline. They had conceded only four goals in that run before shipping six on matchday two.
- Champions of Serbia in 2017/18, when they reached the UEFA Europa League round of 32, Crvena zvezda came through four qualifying rounds to reach the group stage – the first time they had successfully negotiated the UEFA Champions League preliminaries at the seventh attempt.
- Crvena zvezda kicked off this season in the first qualifying round, where they got the better of Latvia's Spartaks Jūrmala 2-0 on aggregate. Lithuania's Sūduva were beaten 5-0 over two legs in the second qualifying round, before extra time secured a 2-1 away win at Slovakia's Spartak Trnava in the third qualifying round second leg to complete a 3-2 aggregate victory. They came from 2-0 down to draw at Salzburg in the play-off second leg, going through on away goals after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- Crvena Zvezda visited England in 2017/18, drawing 0-0 at Arsenal in the UEFA Europa League group stage, having lost 1-0 at home. They were beaten on their first three trips but have lost only one of the last six games in the country (W1 D4) – the 1991 UEFA Super Cup at Manchester United (0-1).
- This is only the third season Serbia has had a team in the group stage, after Partizan's participations in 2003/04 and 2010/11.
- Crvena zvezda are one of three newcomers to the UEFA Champions League group stage this season, alongside Hoffenheim and Young Boys.

## Latest news

### Liverpool

- After winning their first six league games this season, the Reds drew with both Chelsea (1-1) and at home to champions Manchester City (0-0) on 7 October before Saturday's 1-0 victory at Huddersfield.
- Mohamed Salah scored the only goal at Huddersfield, his first for his club since 22 September and his fourth in this season's Premier League; he had five at the same stage of 2017/18.
- That winning run was the first time in the club's history they have kicked off a season with six league victories. Liverpool had not won six league matches in a row since a run of nine successive victories between February and April 2014.
- Having won their first seven matches in all competitions this season, the Reds were without a win in four (D2 L2) before the weekend.
- Liverpool paid a world-record fee for a goalkeeper this summer to bring in Alisson from Roma – this was quickly eclipsed by Chelsea's signing of Kepa Arrizabalaga.
- James Milner's nine assists in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League set a new competition record.
- Virgil van Dijk and Georginio Wijnaldum both scored in the Netherlands' 3-0 defeat of Germany in the UEFA Nations League on 13 October.
- Salah scored direct from a corner as Egypt beat Swaziland 4-1 in Cairo in CAF African Cup of Nations qualifying on 12 October.
- Van Dijk missed the Netherlands' friendly against Belgium on 16 October as he was still suffering from bruised ribs sustained against Southampton on 22 September but he was fit to play at the weekend.
- Salah recovered from a muscle problem picked up with Egypt to face Huddersfield, but Naby Keïta (hamstring) and Sadio Mané (hand) were sidelined having suffered injuries on international duty.
- Milner had to be replaced in the first half of the 0-0 draw with Manchester City after picking up a hamstring injury but started at Huddersfield.
- Adam Lallana made his first appearance since 20 August at Huddersfield after recovering from a groin injury; he lasted 69 minutes before going off with cramp.
- Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain is unlikely to play this season after suffering a serious knee injury in last season's UEFA Champions League semi-final first leg against Roma on 24 April.

### Crvena zvezda

- The defeat in Paris on matchday two ended Crvena zvezda's 34-match unbeaten run in all competitions (W26 D8), stretching back to the 1-0 loss at CSKA Moskva in last season's UEFA Europa League round of 32 second leg, although they did lose on penalties in the Serbian Cup against Mačva on 14 March after a 0-0 draw.
- Crvena zvezda are 38 matches unbeaten in the Serbian Super League (W34 D4), since a 1-0 loss against Napredak on 1 October 2017. They were 3-1 winners at home to Rad on Saturday.
- The Serbian champions won their first seven games in this season's Super League, making it 17 in a row, before being held 1-1 at Belgrade rivals Partizan on 23 September. They have won all four matches since.
- Richmond Boakye scored twice against Rad, making it five goals in four league appearances this season.
- Branko Jovičić made his international debut for Serbia in a 2-0 win away to Montenegro on 12 October.
- Filip Stojković was replaced late on in Montenegro's 4-1 UEFA Nations League win in Lithuania on 14 October having suffered a minor injury. He started against Rad but was replaced on 36 minutes.
- Crvena zvezda captain Vujadin Savić had been out with a hamstring injury since matchday one before returning in Paris; he was replaced at half-time and has not featured since.

## Head coach

---

### Jürgen Klopp

---

**Date of birth:** 16 June 1967

**Nationality:** German

**Playing career:** Glatten, Ergenzingen, Pforzheim, Eintracht Frankfurt, Viktoria Sindlingen, Rot-Weiss Frankfurt, Mainz

**Coaching career:** Mainz, Borussia Dortmund, Liverpool

- Having spent his early career in the lower leagues and failed to break into Eintracht's first team, Klopp turned professional with Mainz, starting off as a striker before becoming a no-nonsense defender. Never played in the top flight but made 325 second-division appearances from 1990 to 2001, setting a club record by scoring 52 goals.
- 'Kloppo', as he is known in Germany, was appointed Mainz's caretaker coach on 28 February 2001, helping the club avoid relegation to the third tier. Duly won a permanent contract and built Mainz into one of the strongest clubs in the 2. Bundesliga; narrowly missed out on promotion in 2002 and 2003 before finally taking Mainz into the top flight for the first time in 2004 and kept them in the Bundesliga until 2007, taking them into the 2005/06 UEFA Cup via the UEFA Fair Play ranking.
- After another promotion near-miss in 2007/08 Klopp left for Dortmund. Took them to sixth in his first season, led them into the UEFA Europa League the next year and then, with a squad full of exciting young talent, oversaw league title wins in 2010/11 and 2011/12, adding the German Cup in the latter campaign with a 5-2 final victory against Bayern München.
- Earned even greater admiration in 2012/13 as he steered Dortmund all the way to the UEFA Champions League final at Wembley, where they lost to Bayern. Dortmund reached another domestic cup final in 2014, but again came up short against Bayern.
- Announced in April 2015 he was leaving Dortmund after that season, which ended with a cup final defeat against Wolfsburg. Succeeded Brendan Rodgers as Liverpool manager in October 2015 and took the team to the finals of the English League Cup and UEFA Europa League – helped by a quarter-final defeat of Dortmund – in his first season. Lost both, and there was more final disappointment in 2017/18, which ended in defeat by Real Madrid in the UEFA Champions League decider in Kyiv.

### Vladan Milojević

---

**Coaching career:** Iraklis (youth), Crvena zvezda (youth), Javor, Čukarički, Omonia, Panionios, Crvena zvezda

- Born in Arandelovac, Milojević began playing football in Crvena zvezda's youth sides before moving on to the first team of Yugoslav league clubs Bečej and Radnički Beograd.
- Milojević moved to Greece in 1993, initially joining second division side PAS Giannina, and later helping Kalamata to promotion to the top flight. He became the first foreign central defender to play for Panathinaikos when he joined in July 1997 and stayed for three years, going on to have spells at Iraklis and Akrotiris before ending his playing career in 2004.
- Appointed to coach at Iraklis's academies in February 2008, Milojević spent 2011/12 in charge of Javor before guiding Čukarički to the club's first major trophy with a shock Serbian Cup final win over Partizan in 2014/15. Took charge at Cypriot club Omonia between November 2015 and May 2016.
- Returned to Greece in August 2016, taking over at Panionios, who were second to eventual champions Olympiacos for much of the campaign, aided by a notable away win in Piraeus. Eventually finished fifth in what proved Milojević's sole season in charge.
- Appointed Crvena zvezda coach on 5 June 2017, he won the Serbian Super League in his debut campaign and kicked off 2018/19 by taking the Belgrade outfit into the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time.
