Match background

Malmö and Zenit both face a must-win fixture in Sweden, with the home side looking to finish third and the visitors seeking to keep alive their faint hopes of a top-two finish in Group H.

- Matchday 2 was the first meeting between the sides, and Zenit's first match against a Swedish club, and it proved an auspicious occasion as they recorded their biggest UEFA Champions League victory with a 4-0 success as a result of goals from Claudinho (9), Daler Kuzyaev (49), Aleksei Sutormin (80) and Wendel (90+4).
- Those are Zenit's only points in the section, however, as a result of defeats at Chelsea (0-1) and home (0-1) and away (2-4) against Juventus, leaving them six points behind the second-placed English side. Malmö are still seeking their first goals and points, having lost at home to Juve (0-3) and Chelsea (0-1) and 4-0 at Stamford Bridge.
- Zenit will remain in contention to reach the round of 16 only if they beat Malmö and Chelsea lose at home to Juventus. Zenit will be confirmed in third place and reach the UEFA Europa League knockout round play-offs if they draw, or if they win and Chelsea do not lose.
- Malmö are unable to finish in the top two. They must beat Zenit to stay in contention for third place and a spot in the UEFA Europa League.

Form guide

Malmö

- Malmö secured their 21st Swedish title in 2020, their fifth triumph in the last eight Allsvenskan campaigns. They were beaten 2-1 by IFK Göteborg in the Swedish Cup final on 30 July 2020, denying them a first domestic double – and first cup win – since 1989.
- Jon Dahl Tomasson's side booked the club's third appearance in the UEFA Champions League group stage by edging through against Riga (1-0 h, 1-1 a) and HJK Helsinki (2-1 h, 2-2 a) in this season's first and second qualifying rounds respectively before winning 2-1 home and away against Scottish champions Rangers in the third qualifying round. They then saw off Bulgaria's Ludogorets in the play-offs (2-0 h, 1-2 a).
- Malmö's two previous UEFA Champions League group stage campaigns came in 2014/15 and 2015/16 – the latter the last time a Swedish club appeared at this stage.
- Malmö finished fourth in their section on both previous group appearances, winning one game and losing the other five in each instance. Both victories came at home, against Olympiacos in 2014 (2-0) and Shakhtar Donetsk 12 months later (1-0). Those are two of only three group games out of 16 played in which the Swedish side have scored.
- Malmö's 2020/21 European campaign lasted four matches. They eased through the first three UEFA Europa League qualifying games without conceding a goal, beating Cracovia (2-0) and Lokomotiva Zagreb (5-0) at home in the first and third qualifying rounds respectively either side of a 2-0 win at Honvéd in the second qualifying round, but then went down 3-1 at home to Granada in the play-offs.
- Defeat by Juve on Matchday 1 ended Malmö's run of four successive home European victories; they have lost just four of their last 17 continental games in their own stadium (W12 D1).
- The Swedish champions are one of only two sides still seeking their first point in the group stage, along with Turkish title holders Beşiktaş in Group C.
- Malmö are also one of two sides still to score in the 2021/22 UEFA Champions League, the other Dynamo Kyiv in Group E.
- Malmö came out on top in their only tie against Russian opposition before this season, beating Torpedo Moskva in the 1988/89 UEFA Cup first round. A 2-0 first-leg win in Sweden proved crucial before a 2-1 extra-time loss in Moscow, Malmö's Roger Ljung getting the decisive goal in the 103rd minute from the penalty spot.

Zenit

- This is the St Petersburg outfit's ninth UEFA Champions League group campaign and a third in succession; they reached the round of 16 in 2011/12, 2013/14 and 2015/16 but have never progressed further.
- Zenit have finished fourth in their section in each of the last two seasons; 2019/20 was their earliest European exit since 2009/10, when they were eliminated in the UEFA Europa League play-offs.
- In 2020/21, Zenit picked up only one point from their six games, losing twice against both Club Brugge (1-2 h, 0-3 a) and Borussia Dortmund (0-2 a, 1-2 h) and once against Lazio in Rome (1-3); their sole point came from a 1-1 home draw against the Italian club on Matchday 3.
- That was therefore the second season in a row that Zenit did not play European football during the spring, having done so in each of the previous nine.

- The St Petersburg team have won only four of their last 21 European matches (D2 L15).
- Zenit have also recorded only three victories in their last 19 UEFA Champions League games (D2 L14) although Matchday 2 did bring their biggest win in the competition; they had never previously prevailed by more than a two-goal margin.
- Zenit claimed their eighth USSR/Russian league title in 2020/21, and their third in a row; their last seven triumphs have all come from 2007 onwards.

Links and trivia

- Malmö coach Tomasson scored a late winner for Villarreal against Zenit in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup round of 32 second leg, but the Russian side progressed on away goals (1-0 h, 1-2 a) and went on to lift the trophy.
- Tomasson also scored in both games for Feyenoord against Spartak Moskva in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League first group stage (2-2 a, 2-1 h).
- Zenit coach Sergei Semak and Malmö's Niklas Moisander were both substitutes as Russia won 3-0 in Finland in qualifying for the 2010 FIFA World Cup on 10 June 2009.
- International team-mates:

- Yaroslav Rakits'kyi played 90 minutes in each game as Shakhtar Donetsk lost 1-0 away and won 4-0 at home against Malmö in the 2015/16 UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Artem Dzyuba scored the only goal as Russia defeated Martin Olsson's Sweden 1-0 in Moscow in UEFA EURO 2016 qualifying on 5 September 2015.

Latest news

Malmö

- Anders Christiansen has played 49 matches in UEFA club competition.
- The Swedish champions had their three-game winning league run ended by a 2-2 draw at home to Häcken on Saturday, only an 84th-minute goal from substitute Malik Abubakari saving Malmö from defeat.
- Malmö have collected 55 points after 28 Allsvenskan games, two points less than at the same stage of last season.
- The Swedish champions have won six of their last nine league games (D2 L1) having managed one victory in the previous six (D3 L2).
- Sergio Peña scored in Peru's 3-0 home win against Bolivia in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 11 November.
- Erdal Rakip missed North Macedonia's recent World Cup qualifiers due to a knee injury that also meant he missed Malmö's weekend draw.
- Christiansen was substituted in Malmö's 2-0 win at IFK Göteborg on 7 November with a hamstring strain and has not played since.
- On 15 November Malmö announced that honorary club president Bengt Madsen, who was president between 1999 and 2010, had passed away aged 79.

Zenit

- On Friday Zenit were 5-1 winners at home to Nizhny Novgorod, making it 16 goals scored in their last four league games and only three conceded. Malcom opened the scoring with his third Russian Premier League goal of the season, equalling his total for the whole of 2020/21, while Dmitri Chistyakov struck the fifth, his first goal for Zenit.
- Zenit were held 0-0 at Ural on 7 November, losing Claudinho to a red card early in the second half. The match was Sardar Azmoun's 100th Zenit appearance and Andrei Mostovoi's 50th.
- Artem Dzyuba, who scored a hat-trick on Friday, had scored in six successive league matches before drawing a blank at Ural. The striker, who scored 20 goals in 27 league games in 2020/21, failed to find the net in Zenit's first seven league games this season before that six-match run.
- Dzyuba is now Zenit's top scorer in the league this season on ten goals, three more than Azmoun with Aleksandr Erokhin on six.
- Dzyuba's goal in a 4-1 home win against Dinamo Moskva on 29 October was his 144th in the Russian Premier League, making him the competition's all-time top scorer outright; he had been level with former Rotor Volgograd midfielder Oleg Veretennikov on 143 goals.
- Zenit were 7-1 winners at home to Spartak Moskva on 24 October, their biggest ever win against the Moscow side and Spartak's heaviest league defeat.

- Zenit's unbeaten start to the Russian Premier League season (W7 D2) ended on 3 October when they went down 2-1 at home against Sochi. The St Petersburg team were also beaten 2-1 on 16 October, going down at Arsenal Tula; it was the first time Zenit had lost consecutive league games since December 2018.
- Zenit claimed the Russian Super Cup on 17 July, beating Lokomotiv Moskva 3-0 thanks to goals from Daler Kuzyaev, Azmoun and Erokhin. It was the sixth time they had won the trophy – one short of CSKA Moskva's record – and a second in succession.
- Erokhin scored the first and last goals in Russia's 6-0 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying win against Cyprus on 11 November. Mostovoi and Aleksei Sutormin scored their first senior international goals in the same game.
- Danil Krugovoi was called up to the senior Russia squad for the first time for that game and the subsequent 1-0 defeat in Croatia, although he is still awaiting his first cap.
- Azmoun scored in both Iran's World Cup qualifying wins against Lebanon (2-1) and Syria (3-0).
- Kuzyaev missed both Russia's recent internationals with a muscle injury and also sat out Zenit's win on Friday.
- Douglas Santos played 59 minutes against Nizhny Novgorod, his first appearance since being replaced early on against Spartak with a muscle strain.
- Goalkeeper Stanislav Kritsyuk has been sidelined since Matchday 4.
- Magomed Ozdov came on in the second half on Friday, his first game since he damaged knee ligaments eight minutes into Zenit's opening league fixture, a 3-1 win at Khimki on 24 July.
- Matchday 4 was Sergei Semak's 146th match as Zenit head coach. He is now fifth on the club list on 148, behind Yuri Morozov (323), Pavel Sadyrin (262), Luciano Spalletti (184) and German Zonin (162).

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, four more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16), Barcelona (2017/18) and Manchester City (2020/21) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Marseille hold the record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 13 in a row between March 2012 and November 2020. The 2-0 loss at home to Porto on Matchday 4 of the 2020/21 competition surpassed Anderlecht's previous competition record of 12 losses in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), Lokomotiv Moskva (2002/03, first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (2002/03, second group stage), Rangers and Werder

Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).

- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fifteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Sébastien Haller for Ajax at Sporting CP on Matchday 1 in 2021/22. That was the fifth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20 and Olivier Giroud did likewise for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.

- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.

- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
